The LRC Offers Academic Support Services for York College Students:

- **Writing Center** - Writing consultations and workshops for all writing assignments in all classes
- **Math Center** -- Math tutoring for MAT102 – MAT172
- **Study Skills Assistance** -- Study skills workshops and one-on-one consultations with a professional study skills specialist
- **Tutoring & Study Groups** -- Guided study groups, review sessions, and peer tutoring for selected courses
- **Accommodations** -- Test proctoring and other services for students with disabilities

- Tutoring programs begin Wednesday, September 9, 2009.
- The LRC is open Mon-Thurs 8 am- 9 pm, and Fridays 8-4. Evening hours begin September 9.
- You are invited to meet the staff and/or schedule a class orientation.
- The LRC is located in the ground floor of the Humanities Center, Room 01. The Writing Lab in Room 06 is open for everyone. Writing assistance is available “on the spot” in the Writing Lab for all writing assignments.
- Student participation in our programs is voluntary and unrelated to course grades.
- You are invited to suggest ideas for new programs or to request academic support programs for specific courses.

Study Skills, Math, Computer, and Writing Skills Workshops

The LRC offers weekly workshops on the following topics:

- Time Management
- Reading and Note-Taking Skills
- Test-Taking Strategies
- Proofreading and Citing Sources
- Beating Math Anxiety
- Use of Computer Programs (Blackboard, PP)

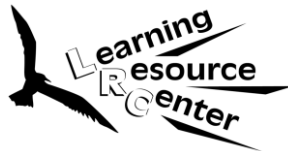
Writing Assistance for Assignments in Every Discipline

The LRC offers writing consultations with peer and professional tutors who are selected and trained by our writing faculty to help students with their writing assignments for every course. In addition, our Writing Lab in Room 06 is open for everyone to write, collaborate, and consult with the writing tutors.

Please encourage use of the Writing Center and Writing Lab early in the semester. To help students learn more about the writing assistance program, peer writing tutors are linked with the first-year composition courses in our Writing Fellows Program.

If you would like to offer your students a short orientation about the Writing Center or hire a Writing Fellow for your class, contact the LRC Director to make arrangements.

To make an appointment for writing assistance, students may call 815-1296 or click on the “For Students” tab of MyYCP and follow the LRC links.



Math Tutoring

The math assistance program offers appointments with both peer and professional tutors who are selected and trained by the math instructors. The tutors are qualified to assist students with the concepts taught in MAT102 – MAT 172. Professors are encouraged to refer their students to the math assistance services early in the semester. Study Groups, Review Sessions, & Tutoring for Other Courses

The LRC offers guided study groups, review sessions, and peer tutoring programs for selected courses. Details about these programs are advertised to the relevant students by email, on the web site, and on the LRC Bulletin Board. Professors who would like tutors or guided study groups for their courses should contact the LRC Director to request academic support programs for their classes.

Services for Students with Disabilities

The LRC provides test proctoring and other services for students with disabilities who are eligible for accommodations. To become eligible for accommodations, students must submit their documentation to the Academic Advising Office. Students who are eligible for testing accommodations should make an appointment in the LRC to take their exam at the same time as the class. The professor must approve the arrangements and send the exam to the LRC secretary. The LRC professional staff will proctor the exam and then return it to the professor the next day.
