Everything you do at your new home will affect everyone else. As such, here are few reminders of local laws and ordinances.

- The number of pets on any premises, regardless of the number of owners, is limited to six animals. All dogs must be under control of a leash when on City public property.
- No person shall recklessly cause inconvenience, annoyance or alarm to another due to fighting, threats of harm, noise, swearing, etc.
- Engaging in loud or raucous yelling, shouting, hooting, whistling or singing on public streets between the hours of 9 p.m. and 7 a.m. or at any time or place in such a manner as to create a noise disturbance is prohibited.

York City Begins Ticketing for Trashy Properties

As of Saturday, July 15, 2017, property maintenance inspectors from the city's Bureau of Permits, Planning and Zoning will begin enhanced enforcement of the city's Neighborhood Improvement Ordinance.

They'll be looking for people who don't clean trash from their yards and alleys, dump illegally or put out their trash days ahead of pickup.

Inspectors will use handheld electronic devices to issue tickets, which carry fines for property amintenance violations starting at \$25 for a first offense and increase to as much as \$300 for repeat violations.

Covered Device Recycling Act

Prohibits the disposal of “covered devices” including televisions, desktop and notebook computers, monitors, keyboards, and other peripherals. These must be recycled at York County Solid Waste Authority, Best Buy, or check with your local municipality for a recycling location.

Trash and Recycling Pickup Information

Trash and recyclables should be set out after 7 p.m. on the evening before the scheduled collection day, and containers should be removed by 7 p.m. on collection day. Please try to secure your trash container as soon as possible once the trash has been collected. Additionally, please be a good community steward and pick up any loose items that may accidentally fall to the wayside as the trash is picked up. This dramatically improves the aesthetic image of the neighborhood. Finally, please refrain from leaving bags of trash lying beside or on top of the Clean and Green trash cans.

Recyclables - Certain glass, metal, plastic, and paper/cardboard go in your house recycling bin.

York City Pickup - Trash on Tuesday and Friday; recyclables on Tuesdays.

Spring Garden Pickup - Based on address, please call 717-848-2858 for correct trash pickup days.

Large Items - Can be disposed of by calling 717-843-1240 (York City only). You are allowed five large items per week.
