***REQUIRED MJR. COURSES: (continued)**

English/Humanities Electives: (12 Credits)

All professional writing majors are required to take at least 12 credits beyond the required courses from English/Humanities department offerings. All courses must be at the 200 level or above. At least three credits must be at the 300 level or above. Six credits must be literature (LIT) courses.

Minor: (15-20 Credits)

All professional writing majors must complete a minor in a field related to their career interests, to be chosen in consultation with his or her advisor.

Minor and date declared:

1 All courses must be completed with a minimum "2.0" grade. Courses may not be taken on a pass/fail basis.

2 A minimum of 12 credits of the Area Distribution Requirements must be at the 200-level or above. Courses may not be taken on a pass/fail basis. See Registrar's Office for official list of courses.

3 Six credits must be in one language.

4 Requirements listed apply to students who matriculate into or declare this major during the 2009-2010 academic year.

5 With the permission of advisor and writing program administrator, students may substitute appropriate writing and rhetoric based courses from other departments.
