ONLINE REGISTRATION

- To begin, create an account and log in to start the registration process by visiting our website: **ycp.edu/register/YCPLLI**
- Click “New User? Start Here” at the top right side of the page.
- Fill in the requested information and click Submit at the bottom of the page.
- Your account is ready. Log in. (After creating your account, you will have the option of adding additional contacts to your account.)
- After logging in, click Membership at the top of the page to purchase a YC-LLI membership. (Membership is optional; however, members receive lower course fees and exclusive access to local tours.)
- Select the Annual Membership and complete the payment process to become a member.

- To register as a nonmember, skip the membership purchase and click Search to find your courses.

This course explores the ecology and ethnohistory of the Northern Plains, the homeland of the Lakota (Sioux) people: Nebraska, South Dakota, North Dakota, Montana, and Wyoming. The Lakota, personified by the iconic Crazy Horse, were successful and fiercely independent masters of the High Plains, archetypical of the nomadic buffalo-horse culture. They fought vigorously to retain their way of life. They were, however, ultimately starved out and subdued. A beleaguered remnant accepted relocation to reservations in the region where they remain, and still struggle, today.
